



VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Luke's Closet was started by a group of busy moms who appreciate flexibility. Our volunteer opportunities are designed to serve our foster/adoptive/kinship families best and fit with the lives of busy volunteers.

>> **To join a Luke's Closet volunteer group**, email kimnickeldesign@gmail.com and specify which volunteer list you'd like to be added to (see descriptions below). You'll only receive email notifications for those specific needs. All of these opportunities, except when noted, are shared via Sign-Up Genius emails.

1) Sorting, Laundry & M.O.M. Drop-off

A sorting session is typically scheduled 2 weekdays/month. Sign up for only the slots and times you're able to help.

- **Sorting:** Sort clothing donations into categories based on quality and type. Requires standing and ability to sort clothes based on quality and type. Each session is 1.5 - 2 hrs. We also offer sorting sessions for High Schoolers.
- **Laundry:** Launder clothes that are perfect for our kiddos but need a fresh wash or stain treatment. Pick up laundry from room 101 in the lower level of St. Luke's after the sorting session. There will be approximately one load every other week. Laundry detergent is not provided.
- **M.O.M:** We often receive donations not appropriate for Luke's Closet but can be used by Middleton Outreach Ministry (M.O.M.) Drive donations from St. Luke's to [M.O.M. during their open clothing hours](#).

2) Shop & Eat Day Volunteers

In March, May, August & November, Luke's Closet hosts a "Shop & Eat Event" for families to shop the Closet and share a meal. Shop & Eat events are typically held on Saturdays from 10am – 1pm. For these events, volunteers are needed as:

- **Greeters** – Welcome families and connect them with a host. Requires a quick smile and sitting.
- **Hosts** – Assist families in shopping. Requires conversation, walking and carrying bags.
- **Servers** – Serve the provided food. Requires hospitality skills -- conversation, walking, standing, food safety and kitchen clean-up.
- **Food Donors** - Luke's Closet will send a list of needed food items for the meal we will serve at the event. Items are typically easy to pick up on your regular trip to the grocery store such as: buns/rolls, deli meat, cheese, fruit, yogurts and dessert. Deliver items to St. Luke's before the event.

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Mission, Vision & Values: To serve and support foster, kinship and adoptive families residing in Dane County, by providing free, high-quality clothing efficiently and effectively. Engage our community by offering volunteer, clothing and monetary donation opportunities. We value Christian service.

3) Fulfillment Volunteers

Be “on duty” for one week (Monday – Sunday) and you choose the week. A Sign-up Genius email will be sent every quarter. You can sign up for as many or as few weeks as works for your schedule. The Luke’s Closet room is always unlocked and accessible during St. Luke’s business and worship hours (Monday – Friday 8:00am – 4:30pm, Wednesday evenings during the school year and Sundays 8am - noon).

During your on-duty week, requests are forwarded to you via email to be filled within 3-4 days. Requests come from an online form detailing clothing sizes and needs. One never knows how many requests will arrive. There have been weeks of zero and weeks of 10. If it’s a busy week, other volunteers can assist. Plan on 30 minutes to pack one bag of clothes. Communicate with the volunteer delivery driver on duty to get bags to the selected location.

Cell phone. The Luke’s Closet cell phone travels with the fulfillment volunteer. This allows fulfillment volunteers to communicate with families without needing to use their personal cell phone. Families may call to request clothing this way. Direct any call you cannot answer to your lead Luke’s Closet volunteer.

Host personal shopping appointments. Occasionally, families call to request personal shopping appointments sometimes due to an emergency placement. It is a very rewarding experience to work directly with the families. Schedule appointments at a mutually agreeable time.

Before your first week, you’ll have a **one-on-one training session with a Luke’s Closet lead volunteer.** On your first week of fulfillment duty, you’ll be paired with an experienced volunteer. Fulfillment volunteers need to have daytime flexibility and ability to follow a process.

4) Delivery Drivers

Once the fulfillment volunteers pack the requested clothing, the bags need to be delivered from St. Luke’s (Middleton) to the selected pick-up site. Volunteers will have the flexibility to sign up for the week that works best for them. We never know where clothes will need to go until the requests are received but a typical delivery is 1 hour. Unfortunately, we are not able to reimburse for mileage.

Our pick-up sites are: Madison East (Trinity Lutheran, 1904 Winnebago St.), Madison North (Dane Co. Human Services (1202 Northport Dr.), Madison South (Dane Co. Human Services, 2306 S. Park St); Mt. Horeb (Evangelical Lutheran Church of Mt. Horeb, 315 E. Main Street); Sun Prairie (Our Savior’s Lutheran Church, 550 Lincoln Dr.) and Verona (Memorial Baptist Church, 201 S. Main St). Requests for delivery to Mt. Horeb and Verona are rare.

The clothes are packed in bags with handles for easy carrying and weigh less than 10 pounds each.

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5) Pillowcase Makers

When Luke's Closet delivers clothing to a child, they are packed in pillowcases that stay with the child. In a life of frequent temporary places and things, this pillowcase may be one of the few things that is permanently theirs. A standard size pillowcase requires 1 yard of fabric and volunteers sew pillowcases at their own leisure. We welcome fabric styles for boys and girls ages 0-18. Luke's Closet can supply the fabric, if requested. We'll send an email when our inventory is low.
